## NOTTON PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council now has a new all-singing and dancing website - **notton-pc.gov.uk** in which you can look and see the dates of meetings, agendas, minutes and lots of other information. Please visit the site and explore! The Village Hall has a separate site - **nottonvillagehall.uk**.

The Council has set the precept for 2020 - 2021 at £9000: this is a slight increase over the past years and the full amount works out as an average of just over £20 per household for the year.

It's nice to see that the Village Green has mostly recovered from parking damage after the Bonfire. It is still too wet to attempt any remedial work, but it has not been forgotten. The Council intends to establish some planting behind the posts on the corners this spring. Discussions have begun on planting ornamental trees on the Green, in such a way as not to interfere with the various activities which take place, but this is at a very early stage. We are getting sponsorship from individuals for a few hanging baskets round the Green this spring. This is an experiment, and if successful will be rolled out next year Parish-wide - if you would like to sponsor baskets on lampposts near you we will be able to arrange it through the Parish Council with the same organisation that looks after the baskets in Walton.

Wakefield MDC Highways have at last produced a plan for more signing and lining works at Notton Crossroads, including forming small "ghost" islands at the junction. Once the works are complete there is probably little more that can be done to improve safety at the crossroads.

There will be a village Litter-pick on 29<sup>th</sup> March - meet at the Village Hall at 10.00. The PACT meeting held on 7<sup>th</sup> January in the Pavilion was well attended, with residents able to put forward their views on what things the Police should be concentrating on. Another meeting will be held sometime in April, and will be advertised in the Council notice boards.

The Annual Meeting of the Council will be held on **Thursday 7th May at 7.00**, in the Pavilion as District Council elections are being held that day. This is a public meeting and residents are encouraged to attend and speak.

## <u>"Notton Pastures" Appeal</u>

The Steering Committee would like to thank the 41 residents who have made donations to the Appeal, which has now reached a little over halfway towards our target of £80,000 but there is still a way to go. Plans continue to be made about the future uses for the land, and all residents of the Parish are invited to a Public Meeting in the Village Hall on **Friday 3rd April at 7.30pm**.

Ideas for possible uses for the land are many and can include tree planting, wildflower meadows, or renting out for horse grazing. As a start to firming up some ideas we have invited Roger Parkinson from the Woodland Trust to this meeting. Roger has experience and expertise about establishing woodlands and meadowland, and he will give an illustrated talk and be able to answer any questions we might have. There will be tea and biscuits!

Residents will remember that the 7 acres of grazing land came up for sale last Autumn, and there was some concern that a future buyer could use the land to the detriment of the village. Following a public meeting the land was secured for 12 months to give time for funds to be raised to buy the land for the enjoyment and well-being of the community. The intention is that the fields will be held by the Notton Village Hall Trust.

In the meantime however we would hope that more residents will come forward with funds for the Appeal. We must emphasise that the land has been bought temporarily on our behalf, and if we don't reach the required total **then it will be sold**.

It is evident that other people are still interested in the fields, and maybe not just as grazing land. Any development here will adversely affect the value of your home. Community ownership of the land for sound environmental use will make the village a more attractive place to live, safeguard the value of your home, and make a positive contribution to the neighbourhood. Ownership of the land by the Trust (a registered charity) will make us able to attract grants to develop and maintain projects.

There are many different ideas about what should be done with the land - but the first thing to do is to buy it, which needs more donations. Please give what you can - there is a gift aid form at the back of the Newsletter.

We hope to see you on 3rd April at the Hall. The Steering Committee

1. After considerable exchanges between Roy Aspinall and the Post Office, we have been successful and the correct relationship will be signed soon. I, and I'm sure everyone would like to thank Roy for the work he has done on this item.

2. We have been successful in recruiting 3 new volunteers, with 2 immediately and the third a little later. More please, your Shop needs you!!!

3. The PO/Shop now has a newly installed portable airconditioning unit, paid for by the Parish Council, to help ensure that all potentially perishable items with shorter shelf life such as milk, cheese, sandwiches etc will be more adequately protected for freshness during the hotter months of the year.

3. Unfortunately, one of our Directors has had to resign due to taking on a substantial charitable commitment. I'm sure all of you would like to thank Guy for his work over the years and wish him well in the future. I am looking for Directors, please get in touch, the position is not that onerous.

4. Finally, resulting from a sustained range of Board initiatives in the last 6 months of 2019 to review and modify and promote the PO/Shop, there had been an encouraging degree of recovery for sales/ turnover. However, more recent sales figures are now showing this to have dropped away again.

This is somewhat disappointing for the Board, and we find oursleves once again having to stress the need for Notton Village residents to more frequently and readily utilise this key historical community hub and all that it has to offer to the village.....

Whilst we've seen good attendance at our first few winter net sessions (7.30pm every Thursday at Stumps in Wakefield), we're always welcoming more players and non-players to join us, shake off the winter and get ready for the cricketing summer, which despite protests from Dennis, Ciara and Jorge, is just 6 weeks away.

### NOTTON VILLAGE HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

There is not a great deal to tell you about with regard to the Village Hall other than the bookings are progressing well and it has been a good year with record bookings from which the revenue helps to keep the Hall a nice place for all the village and the surrounding community.

The new social pavilion is also getting a few bookings which is nice to see. We have a few upgrades planned for this coming year for the hall and pavilion which will be discussed at the next management meeting on the  $25^{\text{th}}$  March. This is also the AGM, starting at 7.00pm. This meeting is open to anyone who wants to come to either listen or see what is happening or put anything forward that they would like to see done in the hall or new pavilion, or even stand for election to the Committee. Please come along - these buildings are for all the village to use and enjoy.

Unfortunately we had a break-in on the  $15^{\text{th}}$  February around 9.30pm: the thieves did quite a bit of damage by ram-raiding the doors with a car, and also stole our PA system and other equipment up to a value of £4500. Obviously the police were called but as of yet nothing has been found and no culprits arrested. Fortunately the insurance company have more or less covered our losses. With the Gala coming in June we need to replace the PA system as soon as possible. We are also looking to make some changes to try and make the building more secure with CCTV and some other adjustments like roller shutters on the rear doors, which are more vulnerable than the other entrances to the hall.

#### NOTTON TENNIS CLUB

Annual membership fees are again due for the year starting on the 1 April 2020.

The membership rates approved at last year's AGM are as follows: Seniors £65, Students £22, Juniors £17 and House Persons (existing only) £40. A discount of £10 is available for Seniors if their membership fee is received by the club treasurer before the 22 March 2020. The discount does not apply to Student, Junior or House Person memberships. Please pay membership fees by CHEQUE (preferred) or cash to the Treasurer, Notton Tennis Club, Nade House, George Lane, Notton, Wakefield, WF4 2NL. It would be very much appreciated if all membership fees are paid before the 22 March 2020.

New members are welcome as always and the start of the subscription year is a good time to take up tennis from scratch or to return to the game having played in the past. We have two of the best courts in the area and a friendly welcoming group of regular players and good availability of courts at present. We play throughout the year whatever the weather. Mixed doubles social tennis is played on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 9.00am. Simply turn up with a racquet and suitable footwear and clothing and give it a try. Ladies doubles social tennis is played on Thursday mornings from 10.00am. The courts are often free at other times when arranged singles or doubles can take place. Visitors are always welcome but would need to be signed in by a Full or Associate senior member of the Club and a small fee is payable.

Junior members have priority on Friday evening and Saturday morning but they can play at any time if the courts are free. They should have a key for the courts only and not the Club House. Juniors are permitted to bring guests when accompanied by a Full or Associate member of the club and a small fee is payable.

Coaching is available at The Wakefield School of Tennis run by Dwight Brown for the coaching of Juniors. Private coaching may be available by arrangement for both Juniors and Seniors at other times. He can also advise with regards to adult coaching at West Yorkshire Sport and Tennis Club.
