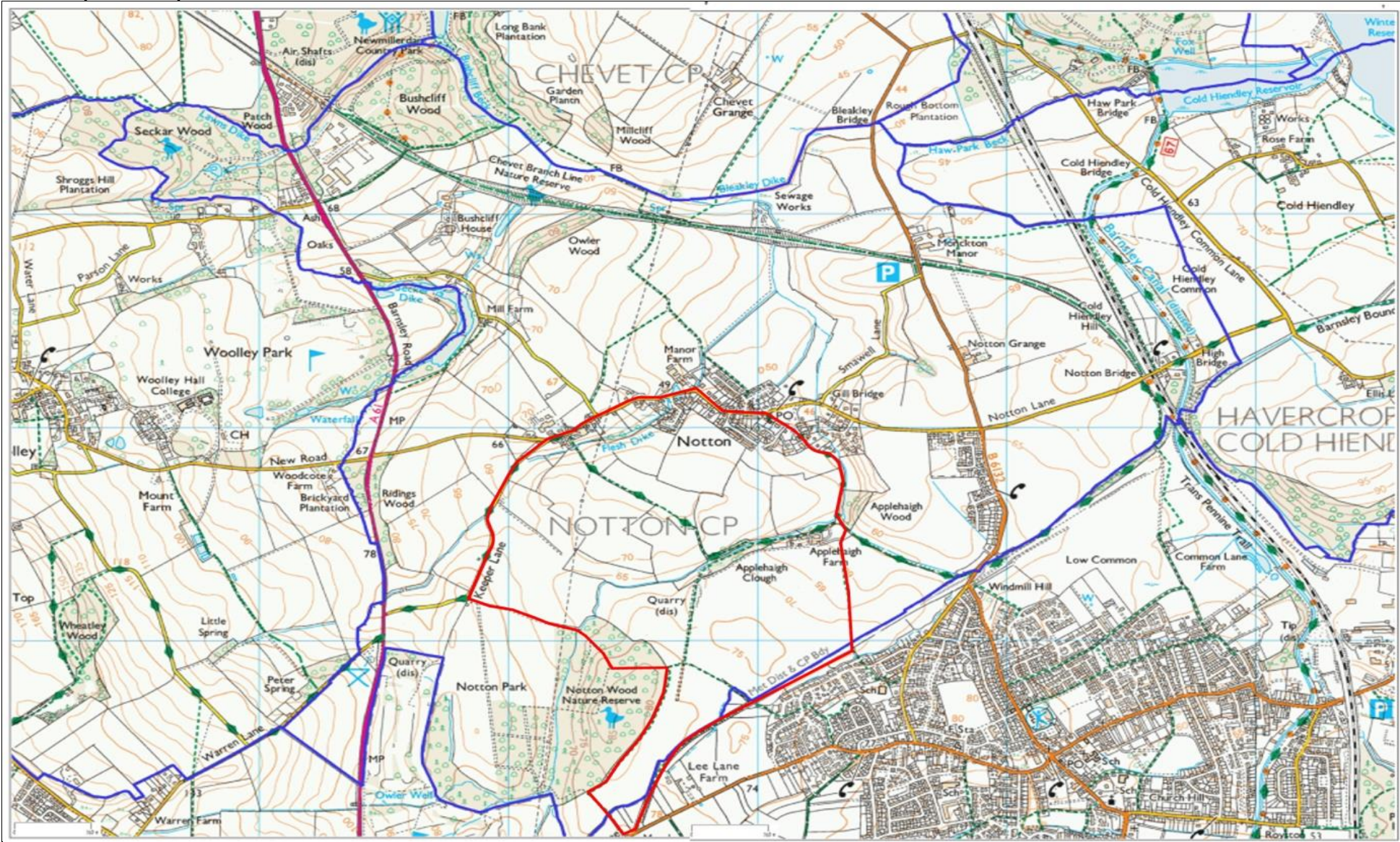


Walk 4 (3.9 miles)



Circular Walk \_\_\_\_\_ Parish Boundary \_\_\_\_\_

**Directions:** On leaving Post Office, turn right, then head S on Applehaigh Lane. After bridge over stream turn half L then in 20 yds R at public footpath sign up steps to follow path S over field to old railway line. At site of old bridge go down steps to old railway turn R and follow it (if flooded walk on the top of the bank) until you come to Lee Lane. Turn R then almost immediately R again at FP onto footpath N towards wood. At the wood, do not go into wood but turn R and follow outer edge to join another path which enters the wood. Turn L into wood, follow path level then down slope, over stream and then between hedge and fence up slope to join Keeper Lane. Turn R, follow lane down, then up hill to turn R on George Lane and return to village.

**Historical Notes:** Applehaigh Lane used to be known as Appleday Lane. If you look to the right when you cross the bridge in Applehaigh Clough you can just see the site of an old dam in the stream bed in front of the new houses.

The old railway that you follow was part of the Barnsley Coal Railway, opened in 1882 and closed in 1961.

Notton Woods includes some ancient woodland thought never to have been cleared. Old maps show the site of a fort or "Danish camp" in the wood.

Keeper Lane is also known as Mucky Lane: it used to have a number of houses on it.

N, E, S, W etc - compass directions. R, L - right, left. FP - footpath sign.
