COOLING DOWN

Wakefield Council is warning everyone, especially young people and their parents, of the dangers of swimming in open water.

As the coronavirus lockdown begins to ease, people have been enjoying the sunny weather in the district's parks and country parks. However, there are concerns that people are swimming in the water at some of these sites, despite signs clearly warning them not to do so.

Swimming in open water is extremely dangerous. Hidden dangers can lurk beneath the surface of ponds, lakes and flooded quarries, such as discarded waste which can trap people, as well as slippery rocks and sudden changes in water depth.

But, if anyone is tempted by a cooling dip, please remember that water can become dangerously cold when it gets deeper and you never know what's under the water such as tangles of weeds and rubbish, which raises the risk of drowning or of suffering a severe injury.

Our emergency services and NHS are already under immense strain so please don't put other lives at risk by putting your own life at risk. Please keep away from open water and stay safe.

GRASS CUTTING

Council teams have continued cutting grass on, or adjacent to highways, roads and footpaths. This is a statutory obligation for the Authority.

Any remaining gardeners are being deployed on maintaining schools, parks, bowling greens, golf courses, cemeteries and crematoriums although the main focus remains on cutting highways grass.

Large areas such as parks, for the moment, are being left, when the current situation eases then normal service will be resumed.

OTHER NEWS

29 car parking areas have been reopened and social distancing signage introduced.

Fishing clubs have been allowed to re -open under social distancing guidelines.



Enforcement and the Police will be

focusing on breaking up groups of people who are not adhering to the self-distancing instructions at some of the busier Countryside sites.

Signs have been installed at all facilities which could encourage congregation including tennis courts, play areas, Multi use Games areas and skate parks advising the public to social distance.

Total number of calls for Environment officer for the last week have been 87 calls from the public and 42 for the Dog warden service.

On the 3 June 2020, in West Yorkshire there are 1,843 cases in Leeds, 1,343 cases in Bradford, 761 cases in Kirklees, 756 cases in Wakefield and 296 cases in Calderdale.

Supporting local small businesses

The Council's six markets support around 200 small businesses and over recent months the Markets Team has been working with traders to help them face the challenges presented to their businesses by the current lockdown measures and adapt for the future. Since the lockdown measures were introduced the Council has continued to run its markets to allow essential goods traders to operate. Whilst this has presented a number of challenges in ensuring the public, traders and staff are able to remain safe it has provided an importance source of fresh produce for local communities and a lifeline for a number of local businesses

This has been accompanied by ongoing work by the Markets Team to help traders successfully access the range of COVID support available for small businesses and the self-

employed, as well as helping traders plan for the changing retail landscape as the current restrictions are relaxed but social distancing measure remain.

A particular focus on the business support and advice from the team has been on helping traders develop an online presence (or helping those who already had this increase their reach) to sell their products and, for those who are able to, diversify into delivery services. This has involved sharing best practice and learning between businesses, signposting traders to further support including training and funding opportunities and encouraging them to think differently about how their business can operate in the future. This work will continue as we welcome back more traders into our markets as and when the wider



WEST YORKSHIRE TRADING STANDARDS NEWSLETTER Scams Trending Regionally & Nationally

- Fraudsters have set up a fake website, impersonating the NHS website. The website contained numerous links that claimed to offer updates about COVID-19. But clicking on the links prompted the user to download and save a file called COVID19.exe. This file contains information stealing malware.
- · Action Fraud reports an increase in emails purporting to be from TV Licensing claiming that the recipient's direct debit has failed and that they need to pay to avoid prosecution.
- An increase in reports of scam callers claiming to be from NHS Test and Trace service asking for payment details in order to purchase a test kit. Currently, coronavirus test kits are provided by the NHS, so they are therefore free of charge. NHS contact tracers will call you from 0300 013 5000 or send you a text message from 'NHS'. NHS contact tracers will never ask you to make any form of payment or purchase a product of any kind and they won't ask for details about your bank account. Contact tracers will not ask you to download any software to your PC or ask you to hand over control of your PC, smartphone or tablet to anyone else. Finally, they won't ask you to call them back on a premium rate number (starting 09, or 087).



General face coverings (including homemade masks and 03 coverings). Intended to reduce the risk to the public but not the individual. These are for use by the general public.

How to spot a fake PPE mask

- . The mask or packaging should have the name and address in the EU of its manufacturer or importer.
- . The 'CE' mark should be present alongside a 4 digit number this identifies who assessed the safety of the product.
- The mask or packaging should be marked with 'EN 149:2001+A1:2009' . The mask or packaging should state either 'FFP2' or 'FFP3'. If products are
- only marked as 'KN95' or 'N95' without the above information they are unlikely to have had their safety correctly assessed.

Walton Sports Club have recently been helped with a grant to update their Referee facilities at the club


Crofton Cricket Club too are being helped with a grant to install bowling nets.
