Council Update

STOP THE PLOP

The Council recently launched a new element of the Keep Britain Tidy campaign specifically focusing on tackling the problem of dog poo. Working with the



dog wardens, suitable locations were identified for replacement signage detailing the risk of a fine.

The Council also created branded poo bags that will be handed out to members of the public to educate them to do the right thing. This part of the campaign has now started to roll out on social media.

VEHICLES SEIZED FOR FLY TIPPING OFFENCES

The new Highways/Fly tipping ASB team has seized 5 vehicles that have been used to commit the offence of Fly-tipping: since the 1st April 2020.

Three of the fly tipping incidents were on private land and the other two were on a highway and council car park. We have had good intelligence and witness statements to support the legal process when seizing a vehicle. The team in conjunction with WDH set up three stings involving a garage and a load of waste with a tracker attached to the waste. Unfortunately, only one of the fly tippers attended and picked up the waste for £55.00. The waste was tipped on a stretch of highway but using the tracker we were able to recover the evidence and seize the fly tippers van.

Four of the vans have been retained awaiting court dates but the fifth one was returned due to it belonging to the fly tippers mother who needed it for work. This case was dealt with by way of a £300 fine costs of removing the waste, cost of the vehicle removal and cautioned for waste transfer.

The team have also had 4 stop and search sessions with WY Police and Vosa. Over the 4 sessions they stopped 45 vehicles and 2 Fixed Penalty Notices for failure to produce waste carrier's licence. One of the FPN has been paid in full and the second one is going to file for prosecution.

During the first part of lock down lots of people were out and about in our Rural areas, so some of the logs could be duplicates with a slightly different location. However, the trend across the district is up by 15% on last year, the council always respond quickly to fly tipping with the emergency response team but if anyone witnesses fly tippers please report with as much detail as possible.

TACKLING SPEEDING CROFTON AND HAVERCROFT

Following a request from the Parish Council we have had 3 'Golden River Surveys' installed along Harrison Road, High Street & Santingley Lane Crofton. We also have 3 along Cow Lane Havercroft.

These are rubber tunes laid across the roads to measure the speeds of traffic and volume of traffic along these routes.

If the data shows that people are speeding then this will give us the evidence we need to push for speeding measures along these roads

PACT (Police and Communities Together)

meetings were held via ZOOM in Walton and Havercroft & Ryhill. The police updated on criminality in the areas over the last few months. Issues raised



included off road bikers, speeding and general quality of life issues.

Sgt Steen and PCSO Leanne Sammut have also set up a number of drop in sessions across the whole ward, including Notton, Havercroft and Crofton.
