NOTTON PARISH COUNCIL

The Council continues to tick over during the post-lockdown period. We have held the July Council meeting via Zoom, at which the annual accounts were approved, but little progress could be made on various projects that the Council is considering. By the time you read this we will have held the September meeting, also via Zoom.

At the recent virtual PACT meeting WY Police representatives were advised of the concerns of residents about speeding on Bleakley Lane and George Lane, and some action was sought. Anti- social behaviour continues to be reported, particularly vandalism to signs and bins, offroad motor biking, and fires being set in hedges. Fly-tipping continues, in spite of WMDC's reinstatement of the garden waste collections. I'd like to congratulate our Parish Clerk, Julia Talbot, who has passed the examination for her Certificate in Local Council Administration, and so is our first qualified Clerk in the post. The road safety scheme at Notton Crossroads is now complete. Cllr Jaggar has continued to put up our Smiley Sid at various places in the parish: the data collected will help in our discussions with WMDC about the chicane and speeding generally.

The Council is investigating costs and possible sources of funding for trees on the Village Green. Planting of five or six trees, on both the George Lane and Applehaigh Lane sides of the Green, suitably spaced to avoid interference with activities on the Green (the Gala and parking for events) is under consideration. The trees could be flowering cherry (like Harrogate), and will have to be heavy standards with good tree guards. If anyone has any comment to make, please contact a Parish Councillor.

SOCIAL COMMITTEE

Notton Open Gardens 5th July 2020:

Thank you to Margaret Shand for organising this lovely event. A big thank you to our residents who agreed to open their gardens. It was well received despite the ongoing situation and made a profit of £723 for Village Hall funds.

Sadly, the current situation with Covid 19 has meant we have not been able to run our usual events over the summer and is affecting the plans for the Autumn and run up to Christmas.

While the Village Hall has reopened to hirers the current restrictions mandated by the Government are proving difficult for events to take place following guidelines on numbers and social distancing and types of events that we like in the Hall.

We are working on a plan to safely recommence Coffee Mornings. Dates will be advertised on the Village Shop notice board. It is likely that we need to change their format as we will need to follow Government guidelines, which are being tightened again at the moment. Details will be circulated.

A Quiz Night was planned for Friday 9th October. A decision has been made to postpone this at the moment . We do hope to run this next year.

Our annual and very popular Christmas Ball - planned for Saturday 5th December is also a casualty of these difficult times. It is with regret that this is cancelled but should be back in December 2021.

The Committee is hoping to organise a residents and their families only "Christmas Spark tacular", again, depending on the new revisions to the Regulations. Further details of ticket sales will be announced when the date is fixed. We would like this to be an all-age event. The only things needed will be a ticket and the right clothing.

Looking into January 2021 we had booked our very popular Elvis night. No decision has been made yet as to whether this can go ahead. As things currently stand at the time of writing it is not possible to have an indoor music event. This will be looked into and again notice sent out if it cannot go ahead. If you are a new resident to the village, we normally have a thriving and entertaining event schedule for residents, but Covid 19 has made many events impossible at present. If it becomes possible to run postponed events, they will be announced via the notice board and the website of the hall.

Thank you for your continued support at this time. It is needed to help keep our Hall as the centre of our community. Please keep checking the notice board outside the shop for updates.

NOTTON VILLAGE HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Not a great deal to report from the last newsletter as the hall is still in partial lockdown, other than a few groups which have returned in a small way with all the social distancing being in force. It is going to be difficult to increase the activities until later in the year or the beginning of next year.

We had a Management committee meeting recently to see if we can hold some more events under the current guidelines, one being the Bonfire and Firework display. We looked at carrying out a smaller event than usual in November for villagers and family members only, but it was decided it would not be possible because of the popularity of the event in the past. People from outside the village would get to hear about it and try and come, and we would be unable to control the situation under the current guidelines.

We are now considering a Christmas event yet to be named with a small bonfire and firework display with possibly a Hog Roast: this would be a <u>village and families only event on a ticket</u> <u>only basis</u> and starting earlier so as to cater for the younger children. The field would be marked out for groups of family in a bubble to keep the social distancing. There would be no parking on the green or village hall car park other than disabled. There will have to be a charge of around £5 per person to try and cover some of the costs but most of it will be covered by the village hall.

It is in its early stage of planning at the moment, and very much dependent on the detail of the newly announced Regulations, and a notification will be put through your door with more details and how to access tickets. We are very hopeful of putting something together for the village to try and celebrate getting past the worst of the Covid 19 and getting back to some sort of normality.

NOTTON NOMADS

Just before the tentacles of Covid - 19 lockdown took their indiscriminate hold on us all with a vicious life changing grip, threatening not only the very immediate future of cricket itself, but the very way of life in communities across the country, and of course Notton was no different.



At the same time all this was happening, discussions were already underway linking Notton C.C. to Barnsley U3A (Google Barnsley U3A .org) who had formed a very strong Walking Cricket team, and the formation of an independent Walking Cricket team The Notton Nomads was formed, albeit mainly with players from Barnsley U3A who lived close to Notton, with one or two players from the Wakefield U3A Walking Cricket team.

The idea always being that local Men and Ladies over the age of 55 would be attracted to this outdoor exercise activity a couple of hours a week, and would join the Nomads. So what is different between "Normal" cricket and Walking Cricket? - Well part of that is in the title - WALKING. The main difference. Using plastic bats and lighter than a cricket ball compound "wind ball" with only 16 yards between wickets, and players bowling underarm if they wish, with no protective clothing required as minimal risk of any injury, about sums it up. - No running! Walking only.

Fast forward past July 12th when lockdown restrictions lifted for 'recreational' cricket, following ECBand village hall, and Notton c.c. guidelines and protocols, the team has started playing again, - every Friday Morning 10.00am - 12.00.

The main issue is we have still not enough members and urgently need another eight or nine Local ladies and gents of a mature age to join us, otherwise we could be in danger of folding before we have actually really got going. - So, this is a plea for new members, our oldest member playing locally (Doncaster U3A) is 94, although to be fair, most Nomads are in their 60's or 70's.
