This year has been a very strange year indeed. The last face to face meeting of the Parish Council was March 2020. Meetings resumed remotely via zoom.

Face to face meeting will start in June with the Parish Council returning to the Village Hall. The Parish Council supported deliveries of food parcels from the shop during the COVID pandemic, supporting residents that could not get to the shops to buy essentials due to shielding.

The council has met 11 of the 12 months of the year all remotely, the parish council did not have meeting in August. There was no annual meeting last year and all Councillor remained in their positions.

District Councillors
