#### NOTTON PARISH COUNCIL

The Council's monthly meetings are now "live" again, in the Village Hall at 7.30 on the first Thursday of each month (not August). Residents are welcome to attend, and to raise any points at the beginning of the meeting for later discussion by Councillors. There will be an online PACT meeting sometime in the future: details will be circulated when we get the information from the Police. Our PCSOs will also attend the Shop on 29<sup>th</sup> July and 9<sup>th</sup>

Hanging baskets are now up on lampposts, after a delay in delivery of the special brackets. We are NOT impressed with the quality of the planting-up and we have taken this up with the supplier. He has promised "free" baskets next year to all those who have sponsored a basket this year, and we hope that more people will join next year.

The Council would also like to thank everybody who joined the village litter-pick in April. There was a good turnout, and a lot of rubbish was collected, especially off the A61.

Building works have begun on the site next to the Shop on Applehaigh Lane. We are monitoring the parking situation but there are legal difficulties with any permanent "hardening" of the Green for builders' vans.

A grant to cover work on the playground at the Village Hall has been submitted. The scheme includes a new seesaw, a big climbing net, and the resurfacing of the rubber safety area. We hope to get a decision in September.

Last year's accounts have been audited and are now on the website and noticeboards for public inspection.

It has been a good year for gardens so far, which means that shrubs and trees in front gardens are beginning to encroach onto footpaths: if this applies to your garden then please trim them back.

Please be mindful of your neighbours if you have a party outside, or a garden bonfire (which should be limited to night-time only).

#### NOTTON PASTURES

The Steering Group is pleased to report that the Pastures are now in the ownership of the village with working capital in place, thank you to everyone who contributed to the fund raising. We are in the process of applying for a variety of grants to fund future initiatives.

The top field is now let for horse grazing on a 12-month trial period. Following on from the advice of last year's biodiversity report we have a plan for how the land might start to take shape. Initially we will plant trees and hedgerow along the Smawell Lane boundary to create a wildlife corridor and the hedgerow along the top of the land will be rejuvenated. We aim to keep the central pasture mowed until next year when we wish to look at establishing wildflower meadow and stream side planting.

Looking forward we shall be working with the social committee to link into any opportunities around the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations to create a national canopy of trees. In 2019 the fundraising to purchase the Pastures arose out of concern to prevent the land being used for detrimental purposes and now we have a wonderful opportunity to create a positive environmentally sensitive amenity for Notton.

There will continue to be volunteer days, and these will be advertised on the Notton Forum as previously. If anyone wants to join the Steering Group, please contact one of us.

It's like a News Flash; it's not a discussion group and chatting is discouraged.

Originally set up for Residents to request or offer Covid-19 related support, now developed into a community and social group. Use it for requesting or swapping information, offering/requesting items no longer-needed - either FOC or for sale, asking for/offering help, asking for recommendations for restaurants, tradesmen, services etc, notification of social or community events, and for discussions relating to Notton

## NOTTON VILLAGE HALL - MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Hopefully we are coming to some kind of normality on the  $19^{th}$  July so that all the activities in the village hall can start again. We have had some small groups using the hall and we are hoping that all groups can begin again in the next few weeks.

I mentioned in the last newsletter that we had applied for grants to improve the Social & Sports field and that we had been awarded a grant from Sport England of £50,000. We have now also been awarded a further £70,000 from the FCC Communities Foundation which means we are able to go ahead with a scheme to install drainage to the whole area and then regrade and level the surface. With this scheme it means that the whole area will not be waterlogged in bad weather and that all the sporting and social activities will be able carry on as normal. We also still have an application for a grant with the Lottery for further improvement works which is well advanced and we will have an answer to that in August. We have also been given a extra grant from Sport England of £6,500 to employ a Sports Surface Consultant to look after the work on our behalf.

As Chairman of the village hall committee I have noticed that there have been quite a lot of new people coming to live in the village and would like to welcome them. Due to Covid you have not had the opportunity to use the hall and do not know what goes on there. Once we get back to some kind of normality you will see that it is a busy place with lots of fun and social activities. If you are interested and want to know what's happening there is a notice board outside the village shop with details for the different events, and the website and WhatsApp (see page 3). If you feel that you would like to be involved or learn more of what goes on in the village you are welcome to come to one of our meetings, the next one being Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> September. These meeting take place every 2 months.
