NOTTON PARISH COUNCIL

A fairly quiet summer was interrupted by the invasion of the sports field off Hudson Avenue by travellers. Although they were moved on quite quickly via a joint effort by WMDC and the Police, they caused some damage to the allotments and left a lot of rubbish behind - residents are congratulated on how well they cleared up the mess. The District Council, who own the land, have now put up a low earth bank around the field to discourage fresh incursions.

The Council's grant application to fund repair and renewal work at the playground behind the Village Hall has regrettably not been accepted. We are continuing to investigate funding from other sources but in the meantime the see-saw will be repaired.

The hanging baskets through the village have continued to improve as the summer has progressed. We are exploring a reduction in cost for next year to compensate for the slow start.

Having a proper flagpole at the Village Hall will let us observe **Remembrance Day**. The Union Flag will be lowered to half-mast for the two-minute silence, at 11.00 on Sunday 14th November, for anyone who wishes to attend on the Green or the Hall car park. At present it is not intended to have prayers or readings.

Aimed at getting news out quickly and consistently about items such as localised criminal or suspicious activity, emergencies, power cuts, fire, flooding, fly tipping, road closures, Parish Council notifications. It's like a News Flash; it's not a discussion group and chatting is discouraged.

Notton Forum

Originally set up for Residents to request or offer Covid-19 related support, now developed into a community and social group. Use it for requesting or swapping information, offering/requesting items no longer-needed - either FOC or for sale, asking for/offering help, asking for recommendations for restaurants, tradesmen, services etc, notification of social or community events, and for discussions relating to Notton.

Users of both WhatsApp Groups have Notton's best interests at heart, treat members with respect, and care for the safety and security of our residents and their homes. NOTTON VILLAGE HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

We are at last seeing hirers return to the village hall and things seem to be getting back to some kind of normality so at least we are getting some revenue to keep our village hall going. We have been quite lucky with grants from Wakefield Council which has kept our funds at a reasonable level. But now that has finished, we need to hire out the hall and restart our fund-raising events.

Further to the last Newsletter I can confirm that we have now secured a total of £198,500 in grants from Sport England, FCC Communities Foundation and The Lottery. The works will start early next year to carry out full drainage and regrading of the Sports and Social fields and hopefully weather permitting will take approx. 8 to 10 weeks. Unfortunately, there is going to be quite a lot of disruption to the Cricket and Archery and other events but when all the work is complete, we will have a much better ground for everyone to use.

At our management meeting on the 22nd of September, we discussed whether we are going to have a Bonfire & Firework Display it was decided to cancel it again this year mainly because of the parking during the event. Besides using the village green, we also used the playing field at the Oval and because of a bund being put up to stop more visits by traveler's it would be difficult to use therefore making more congestion in the village. As Chairman I must say I do not agree with the cancelling of the event but must abide by the majority of the committee. I feel that the benefits to the village and Hall and enjoyment to many people outweigh the disruption of 4 hours parking in the village on the night. We have had the same problem every year and we try our best to keep things going and the upside is the money raised for the hall and many local charities.

As reported before we have made a nature walk down at the Ings at the bottom of the playing fields: this work is still ongoing and makes a lovely walk for Notton residents. There is on-going maintenance for a project like this and we are looking for volunteers to help with that. Over the next couple of months, we will be looking for help from anyone who is able to come down. If you are able, can you contact John Hicks or myself so we can arrange a time.

On the 19 th of September we had a social meeting in the village hall to welcome newcomers to the village: it was a very good and enjoyable. I think it showed the people how nice the village hall is and how lovely the villagers are who organize events and gatherings. I would like to follow on from this and ask anyone who wants to be involved with the hall or find out more about the committee please give me a call. As a committee we meet for a couple of hours usually on a Wednesday evening at 7.30pm every two months and we would love to have some new people on board with their new ideas.
