NOTTON Sports & Social Field

The work to the sports field was progressing very well but there has been problems with deep underground area's of water which caused the contractor big problems in getting the ground levels upto the required standard. In some area's it was impossible to run on with plant used to get an even surface as the tractors were leaving deep ruts. Although there has been drainage put in to all the sports field it will take several months before this starts to really work.

We have had another problem since the grass seed was sown the weather hasn't been very good for growing grass seed and although it germinated very quickly it never really got established because of the very dry weather and had actually started to die back.

With the above problems the contractor has had to revise the situation and we have now started a different method and regraded the whole area using different machinery which has in turn damaged the new grass seed. We have now got a new grade level surface and it is now waiting to be reseeded when the conditions become more favourable. This will probably be towards the end of August.

Unfortunately the above work hasn't gone to plan as we were hoping that the cricket club were going to be able play matches from the 28 th of July this obviously will not happen now and the village hall is sorry that the club has lost the ground for the season.

This will mean that the field will also stay closed to the people of Notton and anyone else until further notice. Alan Shand – Management Committee Chairman (07703 133392)

Our tennis year starts in April and we have forty adult members who have joined the club this year. Some of whom are new members and have just moved into the village or the surrounding area and are attracted by the fact that we have social tennis four mornings a week which is quite unusual. They will be able to gain access to the court using a code for the new padlock. Last year's gate keys are now obsolete.

The membership rates approved at last year's AGM are as follows:

Seniors £65, Students £22, Juniors £17.

Please pay membership fees by CHEQUE (preferred) or cash to the Treasurer, Notton Tennis Club. New members are welcome as always and the start of the subscription year is a good time to take up tennis from scratch or to return to the game having played in the past. We would welcome any new members to join the committee and maybe take an active part in running the club as we have a few retirees this year. We have two of the best courts in the area and a friendly welcoming group of regular players and good availability of courts at present. We play throughout the year whatever the weather. Mixed doubles social tennis is played on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 9.00am. Simply turn up with a racquet and suitable footwear and clothing and give it a try. Ladies doubles social tennis is played on Thursday mornings from 10.00am. The courts are often free at other times when arranged singles or doubles can take place.

Visitors are always welcome but would need to be signed in by a Full or Associate senior member of the Club and a small fee is payable.

Junior members have priority on Friday evening and Saturday morning but they can play at any time if the courts are free. Juniors are permitted to bring guests when accompanied by a Full or Associate member of the club and a small fee is payable.

Coaching is available at The Wakefield School of Tennis run by Dwight Brown for the coaching of Juniors. Private coaching may be available by arrangement for both Juniors and Seniors at other times.
