Reading stories can help you live longer!!

Why am I telling you this? As a volunteer in the Village Shop, I now have responsibility for our second hand bookshelves. After 10 years, Pat Aspinall has stepped down from this role and we should all thank her for a sterling job well done.

We've made a few changes in order to make better use of space and to improve accessibilty. Bookshelves are now to the right as you enter the shop - adjacent to the coffee tables and chairs to encourage browsing. The vertically challenged amongst us should now be able to reach the top shelf without risk of injury! Books are arranged in alphabetical order by author and in genres as far as possible - not easy in limited space! There will be periodic special offers to clear old stock.

All books are now just £1 for a trial period - so far this seems to be having a positive effect on sales. Because the books are donated it means that all profit helps the Village Shop. If you would like to donate books that are in good condition they would be most welcome. Please restrict donations to adult fiction/biographies/non-fiction that will fit a normal sized bookshelf. Unfortunately we don't have the space for large format books such as cookery, craft, gardening etc.

NOTTON PARISH COUNCIL

You will have seen the trees - crab apples and silver birch - recently planted on the Green, to note the 70^{th} Jubilee of the late Queen Elizabeth II. A plaque has been erected to mark the occasion. The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 which invites everyone across the UK to plant trees.

The Police Safe Scheme has continued, with extra patrols by officers.

We have ordered 20 summer hanging baskets this year, with a different supplier. We will be in touch with all those who sponsored a basket last year in the hope that they will volunteer sponsorship again. If anyone else would like to join the scheme please contact the Clerk.



We have (eventually) made contact with a real person in Northern Powergrid to discuss the frequent short power cuts in the village. It seems that the problem may be trees or other objects interfering with the high voltage overhead connections to the village, and she has promised to investigate them.

The Council has set up a sub-committee to look at speeding through both the upper and the lower village to examine possible remedies which might be taken on board by Wakefield MDC Highways.

Election of members to the Parish Council will be held this May, concurrently with the District Council elections. Council meets eleven times a year and the 5 councillors serve a 4-year term. We are strictly non-political. Apart from the meetings, you can take on as much or as little work as you wish - there are often individual projects - signs, speeding, the Village Newsletter, Website etc that might interest you. Nomination forms will be available from the Parish Clerk or Electoral Services in Wakefield MDC - 01924 305020, and must be submitted in March.

NOTTON TENNIS CLUB

Greetings everyone. Our tennis year starts in April and we hope to welcome all our past players and new ones too.

New members are welcome as always and the start of the subscription year is a good time to take up tennis from scratch or to return to the game having played in the past. We would welcome any new members to join the committee and maybe take an active part in running the club as we have a few retirees this year.

Some of our new members who have just moved into the village or the surrounding area are attracted by the fact that we have social tennis four mornings a week which is quite unusual in the area. Mixed doubles social tennis is played on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 9.00am. Ladies doubles social tennis is played on Thursday mornings from 10.00am. The courts are often free at other times when arranged singles or doubles can take place. Visitors are always welcome but would need to be signed in by a Full or Associate senior member of the Club and a small fee is payable. Simply turn up with a racquet, suitable footwear and clothing and give it a try.

The courts will be cleaned and treated to deal with moss growth in late February in readiness for the start of the season. Both courts and the surrounding area look very smart and well cared for at the moment, thanks to our current gardener.

Our 2023 season begins at 2pm on Saturday April 15th with a Round Robin Tournament and tea and cake. We are also having an Open Day on Saturday May 13th between 2-4pm. to which members and non members are welcome. Junior members have priority on Friday evening and Saturday morning but they can play at any time if the courts are free. Juniors are permitted to bring guests when accompanied by a Full or Associate member of the club and a small fee is payable.

The gate padlock code will be changed on the 1 April 2023. Fully paid up members will be advised of the new code on receipt of their subscriptions.

Coaching is available at The Wakefield School of Tennis run by Dwight Brown for the coaching of Juniors. Private coaching may be available by arrangement for both Juniors and Seniors at other times. He can also advise with regards to adult coaching at West Yorkshire Sport and Tennis Club.

During February an electrical insulated strand was fitted around the horse grazing perimeter to prevent the horses leaning on the new fence. Drainage works have also been undertaken by the committee members at the top gate where access to the fields was becoming problematic due to very wet ground. This was carried out at nil cost by using materials already available.

We are planning a Family Day with the intention of raising awareness about the Pastures and the work we are doing to protect our environment and create a space for now and future generations to be able to use. Village Hall

The hall is being used more and more for many events run by our fundraising committee and also many different functions run by hirers of the hall. The footpath down the Ings is now fully open again after part of it was cut off by fallen willow trees. A few volunteers and the Archery Club cut up the trees and removed them. It is now clear all the way around and is a lovely short interesting walk.

The field is now starting to show signs of new growth and has already had a good raking and its first grass cut of the year along with a fertilizer. We have also put some extra drainage at the bottom of the road down to the bonfire where we have always had problems with water.

Because of the problems we had with the hot dry summer and the grass not growing as we had expected we are hoping that the cricket club and archery will be able to use the field as normal this year.

Another further development is that we are in negotiation with a local junior ladies football team coach for playing 7 and 9 aside football on the new football pitch. It is in it's early stages but they seem very keen to make our football pitch there home ground.

It opened officially in June 2019 and is a bright, modern and welcoming space, available to hire at reasonable rates. It is ideal for smaller numbers (seating 25/30) or more intimate gatherings, parties, private functions, or for social or corporate meetings or classes. It has been used for Police PACT meetings, various village committee meetings, christening parties, birthday parties, wedding showers, craft sessions, music practice sessions, business meetings, seminars, and funeral wakes; it's very versatile!
