I'll start with the good news, we have a new tenant in the flat, which of course is great as this helps with the financing of the shop. The young man is called Amos Luke, he's a very nice guy, so if you see him, please introduce yourself and make him feel welcome in the village.

Now I must let you know about the bad news. The shop was unfortunately burgled in the middle of the night. The people involved smashed the door open, rushed in grabbed what they could, and left. The alarm worked, unfortunately the individuals couldn't be identified on *CCTV*.

David was first class, and so were many others. I cobbled together the lock on the door, so we could still lock it. Pat Batty said her son in law might be able to help. He took a day off work the following day and fitted new security equipment to the front door, and refitted the post office internal security door. We owe him our sincere thanks. I would also like to thank everyone who rallied round, I believe we only lost half a day's trade at the post office counter, with the rest of the shop remaining open.

Roy Aspinall was involved all the way through, sourcing people to make permanent repairs and dealing with the Post Office and the Insurance Company. The end result is that we now have two new doors, and the claim settled. No one should think we've made a profit, we have an excess but I must thank Roy for his excellent work in dealing with the claim.

The Shop this year has had a torrid time, six months without a tenant in the flat, considerable cost in renovations, and now the burglary.

We are now living on reserves. PLEASE USE YOUR VILLAGE SHOP.


#### NEWS FROM THE SHOP

## NOTTON PASTURES

A successful family fun day was held in May with about 50 people attending, some of whom were new to the village. The children particularly enjoyed the storytelling and guessing the horses' names and the plant stall proved popular. Seed bombs were made and thrown around the field and it was a great way to get the children connected with nature. All in all a very enjoyable Sunday afternoon.

The community meadow is now being regularly mowed by one of the local farmers and the volunteers continue to keep the areas around the whips and benches mown, which means the docks, nettles and thistles are being contained. The edge along the beck is being left to be a natural riparian strip as part of the countryside stewardship grant conditions.

The horse grazing licensees continue to be happy with the paddock. The pathways around the Pastures are all accessible and make for a very pleasant walk and there are now three benches at the top of the community meadow.

The Council intends to plant a row of eight flowering cherry trees on the Green, parallel to George Lane about 20 feet from the kerb, and protected with tree guards to avoid damage when the Green is being used for parking or galas. We hope to obtain a grant from Wakefield MDC, and they will be planted (mostly by volunteers) in early December.

The ongoing problems with vandalism and break-ins were discussed at the recent PACT meeting, at which the police took note of our concerns. The Police Safe Scheme will continue, with extra patrols by officers. We are trying to get something done about the derelict bungalow at the bottom of Grimpit Hill.

This year's summer hanging baskets, from a different supplier, have again proved to be a disappointment compared with displays in neighbouring villages. We have taken the matter up with the contractor before possibly committing to further expense next year.

Our pestering of Northern Powergrid to discuss the frequent short power cuts in the village have finally born fruit. They will undertake a "vegetation management programme" (tree cutting?) in early September and this will involve a day's power outage for some or all of the village. The actual date will be posted on Notton Forum and Bulletin as soon as we know it, and residents will be contacted by Powergrid.

Again, after nagging by us and members of the public, Wakefield MDC will resurface George Lane between Manor Close and the Green. There will be a road closure, probably between  $4^{th}$  -  $6^{th}$  September (perhaps before you get this newsletter). We also keep raising the possibility of lighting at Woolley Crossroads, which has a poor accident record, but we are told that there are problems with the power supply (in spite of the existence of an 11kv line and transformer overhead).

We have been suggesting that WMDC should replace the litter bin which some idiot burned out in the Smawell Lane car park, which would make the work of the volunteer litter-pickers easier.

Our recent grant application for works on the Playground was not successful, but we shall keep trying! In the meantime some sticky rubber repair work to the safety surface has been done by volunteers. Peter Taylor, Chairman

## NOTTON TENNIS CLUB

Greetings everyone. Our tennis year starts in April and we have welcomed many of our past players and quite a few new ones too. Our membership is very healthy this year. We have joined the LTA which has many advantages for Adults and Juniors. We will be able to reach more potential players via its website.

New members are welcome as always and the start of the subscription year is a good time to take up tennis from scratch or to return to the game having played in the past. We would welcome any new members to join the committee and maybe take an active part in running the club as we have a few retirees this year. Some of our new members who have just moved into the village or the surrounding area are attracted by the fact that we have social tennis four mornings a week which is quite unusual in the area. Mixed doubles social tennis is played on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 9.00am. Ladies doubles social tennis is played on Thursday mornings from 10.00am. We also have social tennis on Wednesday evening and Saturday afternoon. We have formed a Whatsapp group for interested players.

The courts are often free at other times when arranged singles or doubles can take place. Visitors are always welcome but would need to be signed in by a Full or Associate senior member of the Club and a small fee is payable. Simply turn up with a racquet, suitable footwear and clothing and give it a try. The courts have been cleaned and treated to deal with moss growth in late February in readiness for the start of the season. Both courts and the surrounding area are looking very smart and well cared for at the moment, thanks to Ed, the gardener.

Our 2023 season began with an Open day which was followed with a Round Robin Tournament in May and another in June to which members and non members were welcome.

The gate padlock code will be changed periodically. Fully paid up members will be advised of the new code on receipt of their subscriptions.

Junior members have priority on Friday evening and Saturday morning but they can play at any time if the courts are free. Juniors are permitted to bring guests when accompanied by a Full or Associate member of the club and a small fee is payable. They cannot use the Club House without supervision by a member Coaching is available at The Wakefield School of Tennis run by Dwight Brown for the coaching of Juniors. Private coaching may be available by arrangement for both Juniors and Seniors at other times. He can also advise with regards to adult coaching at West Yorkshire Sport and Tennis Club.

## NOTTON VILLAGE HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

#### Village Hall

The hall is being used more and more for many functions run by our fundraising committee and also many different functions run by hirers of the hall. The hall is maintained to a high standard, and we are always looking for volunteers to help maintain this so if anyone is available to help could you please contact me. Also, as I have said quite a few times over the past newsletters, we are looking for volunteers to join the committee, we only meet every two months that obviously is only 6 meetings a year about 1.5 hours long each time. We need your help and ideas to keep our hall going. We have had quite a few newcomers to the village it wouldbe great to see some of you come along and see what goes on in the village hall. If anyone is interested please give me a call.

This summer we have just had a new boiler fitted as the old one was letting us down more often. We had the old one for 19 years, so it didn't do too badly but the cost, which was nearly £4000, has obviously taken a lump out of our hard-earned funds.

The hires of the hall just about pays for the general maintenance but do not cover us for large capital costs and large maintenance bills. We have just recently had to increase our hire rates for the hall and pavilion, which we had to do as our costs have soared like everyone's. It is the first time we have done this for quite a few years. The rates are still competitive for the quality of the venue.

#### Notton Gala

Unfortunately, the Gala was a complete washout as it never stopped raining on the day. It was very unfortunate as there wasn't going to be a Gala this year as there was no one to run it. But John Proctor, who has done the children's rides and amusements for many years asked the committee if he could run the Gala to keep the tradition going in the village. He organized the whole Gala on the lines we have always done and then intended to contribute to the village hall if it was successful. Unfortunately, that hasn't happened and now looks likethe Gala in future years may not happen unless someone comes forward to organize one.

It is sad that all these traditional events are going: not only have they brought a lot of enjoyment to people of the village and surrounding area but bring revenue to the upkeep of the village hall and donations to many charities.

## Notton Bonfire and Firework Display

I know it's still summer, but we are already organizing our annual event which this year will be on Saturday the 4 th of November. It will be run the same as last year and will be a ticket only event and there will be no sale of tickets at the gate. At the moment we are not able to say the price will be the same as last year as we are waiting for an answer from the Firework company to confirm the price. We are hoping to keep them the same, but we will post it on the website as soon as we know.

It has been used for Police PACT meetings, various village committee meetings, christening parties, birthday parties, wedding showers, craft sessions, music practice sessions, business meetings, seminars, and a funeral wake; it's very versatile!
