NOTTON PARISH COUNCIL - MARCH 2024

The cherry trees (and a few extras) were planted on the Green by volunteers in early January. The proposals had been (mostly) well received and we hope the trees will in time add to the attractiveness of this part of the village. The muddy mess created by builders vans on the east side of the Green will be reinstated when the houses are finished.

Hanging baskets will be back in June, this time to be supplied by T+D, our grass-cutting contractors. They provide the baskets in Sandal and Crigglestone, to a better standard than our previous supplier. We think that we have found a contractor who will get some of the older items of playground equipment repainted this summer, and other maintenance work will be done by volunteers. Efforts to find grants for a full refurbishment have not been successful.

The executors of two villagers who have died recently have asked for a memorial bench to be placed on the Green - discussions on the exact site are ongoing.

Our thanks are due to the residents who continue to pick up litter, on a voluntary basis. WMDC have a limited budget for litter-picking so we would encourage residents to clear up near their houses (and the other side of the road where applicable) as much as they can.

Finally, please pick up after your dog, including on the public paths and the old railway line.

POWER OUTAGES

Following the Parish Council's successful campaign for action over many months, Northernpowergrid (NPG) carried out extensive tree work last summer to deal with the issue of frequent power outages in the village.

This is successful to date, especially so in the light of several periods of strong and gusty winds.

The Parish Council has continued to maintain contact with NPG and further work was completed on the "Woolley Feed" to the western end of the village on 12th February. It is anticipated that more work may be require to this feed, but is very much in the planning stages.

We do not know what might yet be done, nor when. Patterns of work will be designed around minimum disruption and agreement on work such that it fits in with farming requirements.

The Council and NPG have agreed to continue the dialogue and keep residents informed as and when any further information comes to hand.

NOTTON TENNIS CLUB

Greetings everyone. Our tennis year starts in April and we hope to have many of our past players rejoining and quite a few new ones too. Our membership was very healthy last year so we look forward to maintaining that. We have joined the LTA which has many advantages for Adults and Juniors. New members are welcome as always and the start of the subscription year is a good time to take up tennis from scratch or to return to the game having played in the past. We would welcome any new members to join the committee and maybe take an active part in running the club as we have a few retirees this year.

Some of our new members who have just moved into the village or the surrounding area are attracted by the fact that we have social tennis four mornings a week which is quite unusual in the area. Mixed doubles social tennis is played on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 9.00am. Ladies doubles social tennis is played on Thursday mornings from 10.00am. We also have social tennis on Wednesday evening and Saturday afternoon. There are two Whatsapp groups for interested players. The courts are often free at other times when arranged singles or doubles can take place for Seniors

and Juniors. Visitors are always welcome but would need to be signed in by a Full or Associate senior member of the Club and a small fee is payable. Simply turn up with a racquet, suitable footwear and clothing and give it a try.

Discussions are ongoing with contractors regarding the re-painting of the courts once the weather is suitable. This is a considerable investment but is necessary to maintain the desirable level of grip and to protect the courts in order to extend the life of the porous macadam surface.

The gate padlock code will be changed on the 2nd April 2024. Fully paid up members will be advised of the new code prior to that date.

Junior members have priority on Friday evening and Saturday morning but they can play at any time if the courts are free. Juniors are permitted to bring guests when accompanied by a Full or Associate member of the club and a small fee is payable. They cannot use the Club House without supervision by a member

Coaching is available at The Wakefield School of Tennis run by Dwight Brown for the coaching of Juniors. Private coaching may be available by arrangement for both Juniors and Seniors at other times. He can also advise with regards to adult coaching at West Yorkshire Sport and Tennis Club.

Did you know....

..... in 1948-9 the villagers came together and raised £1900 via donations and loans to build a Village Hall. Part of the land had been given for the purpose by a local farmer, and part had been purchased. At that time the Hall Committee members mostly came from the Bleakley Lane area, before the development of the lower village. By 1950 the first hall had been built and the Notton Village Hall Trust had been registered. The Committee had still to clear £400 of borrowings but was hopeful of raising funds for sports facilities. The tennis club and cricket field followed.

The building was a converted RAF hut, with outside toilets, and it was always seen as a temporary structure. It was replaced by the present Hall in 1983, not without some controversy in the village, with a grant from Wakefield Council and funds raised by the Committee.

In the 1940s and 50s Galas to raise funds for a hall were held at Wagstaff's farm at Notton Grange, but after the cricket field at the Hall had been purchased the summer Galas moved to the lower village. Up to the late 1960s the Green was an area of rough ground covered in nettles and rubbish: it was not finally levelled and grassed until 1970 -71, and the first "big" Gala was held there in 1975. The "slip road" on the east side was an unsurfaced track until the mid-70s.
