We've also just ordered new chairs, in grey to coordinate with the new colour scheme, to replace the red ones which have served us very well for many years but were starting to show some wear and tear. The Bonfire website (www.nottonbonfire.co.uk) is set up and ready to activate, along with the link for the online purchase of tickets. Tickets will be **ON SALE FROM 1**st **OCTOBER**, both in the Village Shop and online. Please note it will be cheaper to get them in the shop as online purchases include an additional administration cost. Ticket prices have been held at £10 for adults / £5 for children under 10. Children aged 2 and under are free.

PLEASE NOTE TICKETS MUST BE PURCHASED IN ADVANCE, YOU CANNOT PURCHASE TICKETS ON THE NIGHT. Ticket numbers are limited for health and safety reasons and the event always sells out so please purchase early to avoid disappointment.

The organisation committee is in full swing and the team have been very busy, not only setting up the websites to advertise the Bonfire and for ticket sales, but completing all the upfront health and safety requirements, ordering portaloos, printing tickets, sourcing all the food etc...etc... the list is long!. NOTTON PARISH COUNCIL

We start with an enormous thank you to Peter Taylor who has been the Chair of the Parish Council for over 16 years and worked for the council for even longer. I am sure this will never be repeated. Fortunately, Peter is carrying on his role as councillor, and we greatly benefit from his experience and words of wisdom.

As the summer sunshine finally arrived, so the hanging baskets blossomed. We hope you are enjoying them, and, after a couple of poor years, our new supplier has done us proud. We will be continuing with this supplier. We would like to consider more, but due to budgetary constraints, we would like to re-explore sponsorship (£70) of at least some of the baskets. We will seek the views of residents in the Autumn.

The playground equipment has recently been repainted and certainly looks a lot fresher. The timing, over which we had no control, was unfortunate at school holiday time, but it appears to have been worthwhile. We will now seek an annual clean to maintain this improvement. We recently had the annual RoSPA inspection, which suggested a few minor repairs, which have been dealt with by volunteers.

Speeding through the village and along Bleakley Lane continues to be an issue which is discussed on a regular basis. We continue to work with the police and Wakefield Council on this. We have

dedicated officers who are now trained in the use of the speed gun, and, on the most recent report,

it was noted that a roads policing officer issued a total of 11 tickets in just 4 hours, 10 of which were for speeding. PACT meetings continue and dates will be on forum and website. (<u>https://notton-</u>pc.gov.uk)

Yorkshire Water are to carry out drainage works in the Hudson Av/Oval/Bleakley Avenue area and near the pumping station at Smawell Lane to reduce the foul water overflows into Gill Beck in storm conditions. We are told that these works may be undertaken this winter.

Dialogue continues with Northern PowerGrid regarding possible future activity, to continue the good work already done to prevent power loss in the village.

Just to remind residents that the 5 village volunteers who sit on the Parish Council hold meetings on the 1 st Thursday of each month, except August, in the village hall. Residents are welcome to attend. They can also contact the clerk or councillors by e mail, telephone or via the website. We do monitor the WhatsApp group and take concerns to the meetings and report back when appropriate.

We would welcome any new members to join the committee and maybe take an active part in running the club as we have had a few retirees. Some of our new members who have just moved into the village or thesurrounding area are attracted by the fact that we have social tennis four mornings a week which is quite unusual in the area. Mixed doubles social tennis is played on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 9.00am. Ladies doubles

social tennis is played on Thursday mornings from 10.00am. We also have socialtennis on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and Saturday afternoon. We have formed a Whatsapp group for interested players.

The courts are often free at other times when arranged singles or doubles can take place. Visitors are always welcome but would need to be signed in by a Full or Associate senior member of the Club and a small fee is payable. Simply turn up with a racquet, suitable footwear and clothing and give it a try.

As I write the courts have been cleaned and we are waiting for a date from the contractors who will paint the courts.

Both courts and the surrounding area are looking very smart and well cared for at the moment. Thanks to Ed, the gardener. The gate padlock code will be changed periodically. Fully paid up members will be

advised of the new code on receipt of their subscriptions.

Junior members have priority on Friday evening and Saturday morning but they can play at any time if the courts are free. Juniors are permitted to bring guests when accompanied by a Full or Associate member of the club and a small fee is payable. They cannot use the Club House without supervision by amember.

Coaching is available at The Wakefield School of Tennis run by Dwight Brown for the coaching of Juniors. Private coaching may be available by arrangement for both Juniors and Seniors at other times. He can also advise with regards to adult coaching at West Yorkshire Sport and Tennis Club.

The Pavilion is situated behind the Village Hall, Tennis courts and Club House, adjacent to the Sports Field. It opened officially in June 2019 and is a bright, modern and welcoming space, available to hire at reasonable rates. It is ideal for smaller numbers (seating 25/30) or more intimate gatherings, parties, private functions, or for social or corporate meetings or classes.

It has been used for Police PACT meetings, various village committee meetings, christening parties, birthday parties, wedding showers, craft sessions, music practice sessions, business meetings, seminars, and a funeral wake; it's very versatile!

Did You Know?

The Village Green has not always been as it is now. In the past it was rough scrub and uncultivated: part of it was the Pinfold, where straying livestock would be penned up - to be released only after the owner had paid a fine to the Pindar. One of the old gateposts is still standing. I have the original authorisation to John Housecroft as Pindar to "impound any horse, mare, gelding, bull, ox, cow, heifer, steer, calf, mule, ass, or sheep found unaccompanied on the highways", at a charge to the owners of five shillings. Part of the area was used as a dump for roadmaking materials: indeed there are records in the Parish minutes of the West Riding Surveyor being asked to tidy them up!

At one point the landowners (the Woolley Estate) were asked if they would allow a Village Hall to be built on the Green, but nothing ever came of this suggestion.

Then in 1966 Mrs Kidson, who had bought some of the farmland around the village when the Woolley Estate was sold off, gave the Parish Council permission to "carry out such work as may be deemed necessary to level and beautify the lands known as the Green", and thereafter maintain it. In 1974 she had the land registered as Village Green.

The Parish Council had the land levelled, using spoil from the housing development at Manor Close, and seeded: the work was finally completed in 1972 with a community stone-picking. The first Gala on the Green was held in 1975.
