It certainly feels different from the last newsletter. The bonfire is over, the Christmas tree is up on the Green (thank you Richard Gill) and darker evenings are upon us. A little early for festive greetings, but we wish you all well.

The Parish Council is still involved in talks regarding speeding in and around the village. A date is being set to meet with Wakefield Council at their offices, to pass on all our concerns and push for

action. This is likely be at the end of this year or just into 2025. The police are still running speed enforcement and issuing tickets to speeding drivers.

PowerGrid are still doing work around the area to try and reduce outages. Notton has been identified as a priority area for 2025. Their presence at a couple of the coffee mornings to answer questions and deal with concerns was appreciated.

We have had an annual check on the playground. A few small issues were identified, and remedial work is being undertaken, where appropriate. The cleaning and repainting of the equipment has freshened it up. We would like to replace the surface around the play area, but this is very expensive and would require alternative funding. We continue to look at grants, but any ideas welcome. The little wooden bridge is to be replaced.

The memorial bench on the green seems to be getting some use and other benches around the Green and on Bleakley Lane, have been repainted.

NOTTON TENNIS CLUB

Notton Tennis Club November 2024

Greetings everyone. Our tennis year starts in April and we have welcomed many of our past players and quite a few new ones too. Our membership is very healthy this year. We have joined the LTA which has many advantages for Adults and Juniors. We will be able to reach more potential players via its website. New members are welcome as always at any time. The start of the subscription year in April is a good time to take up tennis from scratch or to return to the game having played in the past. We would welcome any new members to join the committee and maybe take an active part in running the club as we have had a few retirees.

Some of our new members who have just moved into the village or the surrounding area are attracted by the fact that we have social tennis four mornings a week which is quite unusual in the area. Mixed doubles social tennis is played on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 9.00am. Ladies doubles social tennis is played on Thursday mornings from 10.00am. We also have social tennis on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and Saturday afternoon. We have formed a Whatsapp group for interested players.

The courts are often free at other times when arranged singles or doubles can take place. Visitors are always welcome but would need to be signed in by a Full or Associate senior member of the Club

and a small fee is payable. Simply turn up with a racquet, suitable footwear and clothing and give it a try.

The courts have been cleaned and painted this year and both courts and the surrounding area are looking very smart and well cared for at the moment. The gate padlock code will be changed periodically. Fully paid up members will be advised of the new code on receipt of their subscriptions. Junior members have priority on Friday evening and Saturday morning but they can play at any time if the courts are free. Juniors are permitted to bring guests when accompanied by a Full or Associate member of the club and a small fee is payable. They cannot use the Club House without supervision by a member.

Coaching is available at The Wakefield School of Tennis run by Dwight Brown for the coaching of Juniors. Private coaching may be available by arrangement for both Juniors and Seniors at other times. He can also advise with regards to adult coaching at West Yorkshire Sport and Tennis Club.

Users of Notton's WhatsApp Groups are required to treat members with respect, and care for the safety and security of our residents and their homes.

THE COMMUNITY WORKSHOP (We make owt in wood)

What we offer is a workshop or a shed in the community where members can meet and have a little bit of self-esteem and self-respect from meeting others, talking part by participating and producing products. It gives them self-confidence & pride. We've had the workshop in the building owned by Cudworth Community Enterprises for over 22 years.

Members have made Parish Council notice boards, five for Notton, and a children's fairy trail map Frame. We made the See Saw for the children's play area in Notton. we made gates for community allotments at Roberts Street Cudworth, and we have built some doors for a patio shed. Members have made other items for their own needs, such as a beehive for a local beekeeper and a workshop bench for a guitar luthier. We made the memorial gates for Albert Shepherd V.C, at Royston Church. We also run woodcraft carving classes in Wakefield. Led by a qualified carpenter and French polisher, these classes teach wood carving skills and run all year.

We aim to train local people in woodcraft skills and provide a low-cost, but well-run facility that is of special interest to the retired or unemployed. Participants will gain both woodworking skills and the self-confidence that comes with participation and achievements.

Our most recent projects were Hedgehog and Bat boxes for the 'Barnsley Business Village:

B.B.V. Quote "In a step towards improving local biodiversity, The Business Village is introducing new hedgehog and bat boxes on site. The initiative is part of a drive to make a positive impact on the environment and aligns with ongoing efforts to support local communities".

These hedgehog and bat boxes were made by members of the community workshop in Cudworth. Established in 2002 by a former coal miner, the community workshop teaches woodworking skills to residents. Equipped with specialist tools, it's a space to create or repair wooden items. Past projects range from making front Doors and Oak Garden gates to more unusual requests such as a parrot stand in a pram. Some projects use recycled wood, while others demand newly sourced materials.

The community workshop isn't only a place for woodworking skills. It's a hub for residents too. The workshop also supports mental wellbeing, managing stress and reducing loneliness.

"We're happy for people to drop in at the Community Workshop. We're based in the Enterprise Centre on George Street in Cudworth. Our opening hours are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday between 9 am and 12 pm. We're only open during school terms though because we share space with the Sidcop Breakfast and Holiday Club."

If you would like to contact or join the Community Workshop, Cudworth, we make anything in wood, (such as; Bird Houses. Planter. Toolboxes. Dolls house. Carved Animals, Garden Seats. Gates etc, and we can repair most wooded items.so, if you need anything done in wood, please get in touch:
